

What Next - FAQs

Do I need a costume?

YES. All teen participants will have a role in the 20-minute evangelistic drama "Toymaker's Son." You will be assigned a specific costume that you'll be responsible to bring but not necessarily wear yourself. Big World will send out your costume assignment in May with specifics of what that includes. You can check out photos of each costume and detailed costume list below.

Once we get to Miami, you'll find out what role you'll be playing in our drama, and costumes will be exchanged among your teammates. We'll be able to make minor sizing adjustments, but if you follow the directions you'll receive for your costume, it will work! we promise!

*If you don't bring the costume you're assigned, you will be required to pay for us to find something in Miami, which is difficult and time consuming for your leaders.

What's Ecuador like?

Quito is one of the most compelling cities in Ecuador. Nestled in a long, narrow valley in the Andes, between the the Volcano Pichincha to the west and the Machángara River Canyon to the east, Quito enjoys a spectacular natural setting. The Ecuadorian capital city's mix of colonial and modern architecture creates a fascinating built environment. In addition to being the site of the Ecuadorian government, Quito is also the nation's cultural capital, with an impressive selection of museums, festivals & markets.

What is the weather like in July?

Quito has a Subtropical highland climate. Because of its elevation and its proximity to the equator, Quito has a fairly constant cool climate, with spring-like weather year-round. The average temperature at noon is 18.7 °C (65.7 °F) with a normal night-time low of 9.3 °C (48.7 °F).[10] The annual average temperature is 14.0 °C (57.2 °F).[11]

The city experiences only two seasons: dry and wet. The dry season, June through September (4 months), is referred to as summer; the wet season, October through May (8 months), is referred to as winter. Annual precipitation, depending on location, is approximately 1,010 mm (40 in).

Where will we stay?

The trip begins in Miami, Fla. While in Florida, we'll stay at a local hotel, typically the Embassy Suites. While in Ecuador, our entire group will stay at a resort-type hotel that is large enough to accommodate and feed us all. Detailed information to come. You'll have access to Internet to stay in touch with friends and family. Your parents will be able to call in by phone if they need to reach you.

*What if I get sick?

We will have a staff of professional medical providers with us just to tend to the needs of our group. They'll be able to deal with minor illnesses and medical issues.
